PREREQUISITES:

There is no subject that must be taught in advance in order to be taught

COREQUISITES:

There is no need to teach other subjects at the same time as teaching this subject

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The subject is taught to students of the Faculty of Dentistry the basics of psychiatry, which is developing rapidly in modern times. Psychiatry has its own system of research methods, diagnostic methods and various treatment tactics. Psychiatry consists of general psychopathology and special psychiatry. General psychopathology studies the characteristics and disorders of the mental spheres of perception, memory, intellect, thinking, emotion (sphere of impression), tendencies, attention, movement and thinking. The care of the mentally ill, the elimination of aggressive and autoaggressive (suicidal) forms of behavior of the mentally ill are of special importance in the subject taught.

The special psychiatry department focuses on the study of individual nosological units in accordance with the modern Classification of Mental Illness. Special attention is paid to the analysis of schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorders, affective disorders (depressive disorders, which are especially relevant for the modern era), organic diseases of the brain, including epilepsy. The diagnosis and treatment of psychoactive substances, including alcoholism and drug addiction, which are relevant to any society, were reflected in the curriculum of the subject. In recent years, special attention has been paid to the study of the clinical, diagnostic, treatment, and prevention of stress-related mental disorders (psychogenesis, crises, and emergencies), as well as concomitant mental disorders associated with other somatic diseases.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

To give students a complete picture of the existence of an independent scientific and practical basis for psychiatry, as well as prevention, early diagnosis of mental illness, indications and contraindications to the use of modern treatments and methods, organization of psychiatric and psychosocial rehabilitation services, timely referral of psychiatrists to psychiatrists . Functional significance of the anatomical structures of the brain.

COURSE RESULTS:

After teaching and completing the course, students must know the characteristics and disorders of the main mental spheres of mental activity, methods of examination of mental

patients, gain basic knowledge about the clinic, diagnosis, treatment and prevention of major mental illnesses.

NOTE:

A minimum of 34 points must be scored during the semester and a minimum of 17 points in the exam. The scores obtained during and before the exam are summarized and the final amount is evaluated as follows:

- A - "Excellent" - 91 - 100
- B - "Very good" - 81 - 90
- C - "Good" - 71 - 80
- D - "Enough" - 61 - 70
- E - "Satisfactory" - 51 - 60
- F - "Insufficient" - less than 51 points

SUBJECT SUBJECTS:

1. Pharmacotherapy of schizophrenia, symptoms, etiology, clinical forms of pathogenesis, types of gait.
2. Schizotypal disorders, chronic dementia, schizoaffective disorders, acute and transient psychotic disorders.
3. Affective disorders. Bipolar affective disorders. Recurrent depression. Cyclothymia, dysthymia.
4. Organic diseases of the brain expressed by mental disorders. Epilepsy. Mental disorders caused by brain damage.
5. Mental disorders associated with sclerosis of cerebral vessels.
6. Mental disorders that occur during development and old age.
7. Mental disorders during infectious psychoses. Neuroinfections.
8. Mental disorders in somatic and endocrine diseases.
9. Mental and behavioral disorders as a result of psychoactive substances. Alcoholism. Drug addiction.
10. Neurotic, stress-related and somatoform disorders.
11. Personality disorder.
12. Mental disorders in early childhood and adolescence.
13. Oligophrenia.
14. Principles of treatment of mental illness.
15. Psychotherapy
